Re: Summer Term Week 7 Headteacher Update

I hope you have all had a lovely half term as a family and managed to enjoy the sunshine throughout the week. This week our Year 11 children continue their examinations. Please continue to keep all of our Year 11 children in your thoughts and prayers as they continue with their examinations.

As Year 10 begin to follow in the footsteps of their Year 11 peers, they have their assessment window for all subjects which begins today and lasts until 14th June. This is an opportunity for Year 10 to showcase all that they have learnt since they began Key Stage 4 back in September. When the assessments are concluded, the teachers will ensure the children are given appropriate feedback in order to allow them to improve their knowledge and understanding.

On Thursday this week, our Apprenticeship Evening takes place for Year 10 in school at 6pm. If your child is in Year 10 and considering an apprenticeship or is unsure of what they want to do for their next steps, then this is a great opportunity to get some of the latest information about applying for apprenticeships locally. You will also be able to speak to Mrs Rarity about how to access additional support in applying for apprenticeships as your child moves into Year 11.

As we start the last half term, we are looking forward to the many events happening including the numerous trips and visits that will be taking place. Mrs Pickles will be sending out a letter summarising the key events so please do look out for that and as always, I encourage you to visit our website and follow us on X (Twitter) to keep up to date.

On the Thursday and Friday before half term we began our interviews for the positions of Head Boy, Head Girl, Deputy Head Boy and Deputy Head Girl. These interviews concluded this morning.
