Re: Spring Term Week 7 Headteacher Update

I hope you have had a lovely half term break and managed to spend some quality time with your family and friends. We really are moving swiftly through this second term. We have several events taking place during half term four. As always Mrs Pickles will be writing to you with the key events letter to allow you to plan accordingly.

As I said in my last letter before half term on Thursday this week, we have our Year 8 Parents' Evening taking place via School Cloud. If you have not already made appointments with members of staff, I would encourage you to do this as a matter of urgency. On Thursday this week it is World Book Day, we will be celebrating with a range of activities taking place across the school. This year we have decided to focus our World Book Day celebrations on the works of Roald Dahl. As one of the nation's favourite children's authors, Roald Dahl's books have influenced the lives of so many children (and adults) and are a perfect example of how much fun reading can be. All children in the school will have the opportunity to read one of Roald Dahl's famous short stories and hear from several members of staff about their favourite Roald Dahl tale.
