## Re: Spring Term Week 8 Headteacher Update

Last Wednesday, 1<sup>st</sup> March, was Secondary School Offer Day where children in Primary schools found out whether or not they had secured a place at their chosen High School. This year was once again the most competitive year I have known at our school with 554 applications for 165 places. This is again a significant increase on the increase we saw last year, again demonstrating how our exceptional school is viewed by the local community. The number of children applying to St James' has nearly doubled since 2019 and hence it is so competitive for places at our great school. We are delighted to be welcoming our September 2023 Year 7 cohort to the St James' family and we are already working closely with Primaries to ensure that their transition is smooth and seamless.

Our Year 8 Parents' Evening took place on Thursday last week with strong attendance again at this virtual event. As always, thank you to all Year 8 parents who attended and submitted their feedback to the parental voice questionnaire that was sent out by Dr Guscott.
