RE: Celebration of the Word – Half Term Two, Week Four

Last week, **we marked Remembrance Day with a whole-school service** that was beautifully led by our Year 11 pupils. The observance of the 2-minute silence on our school grounds was a moving tribute, and our talented prefect's performance of The Last Post added a powerful touch. Our entire school family honoured the occasion with great respect and sincerity, with all year groups coming together to remember those who sacrificed their lives for our freedoms. It was an inspiring moment in our school day that truly reflected the values of courage, unity, and peace that guide us today. Last week, we also welcomed **The Catholic Schools Inspectorate** into our school to observe Catholic Life and Mission, Religious Education and Collective Worship within our school community. I would like to say a huge thank you to all parents and children who supported the inspection in any way.

This week, our Gospel reading and school Celebration of the Word is from **Mark 13:24-32.** In this passage, Jesus speaks of a time of great change, reminding His disciples to stay alert and faithful, as no one knows the day or hour of His coming. He says, *"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away."* This message encourages us to live with a sense of readiness, hope, and trust in God, even in uncertain times. May this Gospel inspire our children to embrace faith, resilience, and compassion in their daily lives.

This week's focus on the **Catholic Social Teaching principle is Stewardship**. We encourage our children to recognise and appreciate the responsibility we each have to care for God's creation. This week, we invite students to honour this principle by being mindful of how they treat the world environment and the school environment. Simple actions like reducing waste, recycling, or respecting school property are ways to live out stewardship in our daily lives. By taking these small steps, we help protect and sustain our world for future generations, creating a community rooted in respect and care for all creation.
