Re: Celebration of the Word

This week's Celebration of the Word focuses on the Parable of the Sower, giving children an opportunity to reflect on the many messages that are still relevant today. The farmer scattering seeds on dry and desert land symbolises Jesus teaching to a closed heart. The first three times, the farmer's seeds either fail to grow or wilt and die. If our hearts are closed and full of bitterness, the teachings of Jesus fall upon us like the farmer's seeds upon the path. When we become excited by Jesus' teachings, but our excitement soon fades as our understanding is too shallow, it's like the seeds landing on the rocky soil. When we believe the teachings but continue to act and think in ways that aren't as God would want, then our growth is stunted, like seeds being planted on the weeds. Only when our hearts are fully open, and truly believe the Word of God will we bloom as people. Just like the plants that bloom on fertile ground, Jesus' teachings will help us to flourish and help us become the best we can be.

The children will be asked to reflect on this parable and think about what they can do this week to allow Jesus' message into their hearts fully so that all of us in our School community blossom.
