Re: Celebration of the Word

This week's Celebration of the Word focuses on the feast of Our Lady Help of Christians which is celebrated this Friday. As you are probably aware, our school and our churches are part of Shrewsbury Diocese, this is one of 22 dioceses in the country. A Diocese refers to a community of the Christian faithful in communion of faith and sacraments and it is led by the Bishop, our Bishop in Shrewsbury is Bishop Mark. Our Lady Help of Christians is the Patron Saint of Shrewsbury Diocese hence why we are focusing on her feast day.

Our Lady is such a key figure in the church and May is the month in which we traditionally honour Mary. Many Christians undertake pilgrimages during this month to shrines associated with the Blessed Virgin. We can find help in asking for Mary's intercession, joining our prayers to her intercession, but also the confidence that God continues to act in the world. God hears the cry of those who suffer and God responds. With maternal love for us, Mary wants what is best for us - she wants Jesus for us.
